Eindhoven iCity Tender

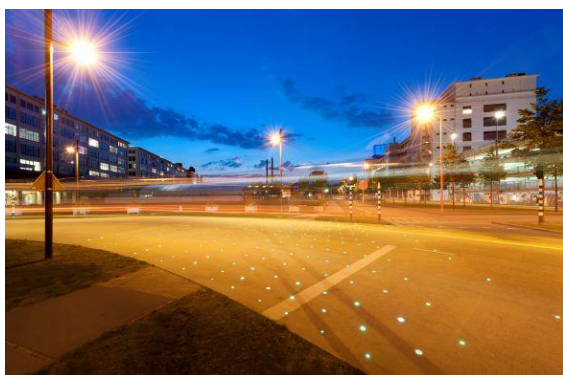

Bilateral cooperation endorsed

TU/e, Fraunhofer, Brainport and the City of Eindhoven have signed a Memorandum of Understanding as a basis for even closer cooperation on research on the city of the future.

The Cooperation Agreement was signed on behalf of Brainport by Imke Carsouw, Fraunhofer's director Wilhelm Bauer, Eindhoven's Mayor, Rob van Gijssel en Elphi Nelissen, representing the Tue and overseen by the German State Secretary, Georg Schütte and Dutch minister, Jet Bussemaker.

Collaboratively, the parties will develop (technological) solutions to answer urban problems as well as challenges for residents of towns in the coming years.

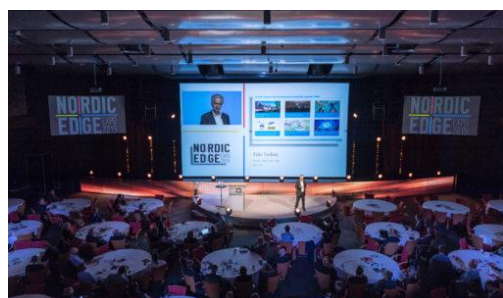
